Constitutional Amendment Election

In Texas, a Constitutional Amendment Election is a type of election in which voters decide whether to approve proposed changes to the Texas Constitution. These amendments are typically proposed by the Texas Legislature during a regular or special legislative session. Voters in Texas can approve or reject each proposed amendment. If approved, the amendment becomes part of the Texas Constitution.

Key Dates and Deadlines

October 6	Last Day to Register to vote
October 20	First day of Early Voting
October 24	Last Day to Apply for a Mail Ballot
October 31	Last Day of Early voting
November 4	Election Day
November 4	Mail Ballots postmarked on or before Nov 4th by 7PMcan be received no later than Nov 5 th

Sample ballots become available 30 days prior to an Election and allow registered voters to familiarize themselves with the choices they'll make on election Day.

Required Identification for voting

Bring any of the below Acceptable ID's to your nearest voting center;

- Texas drivers license issued by the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS)
- Texas Election Identification Certificate issued by DPS
- Texas personal identification card issued by DPS
- Texas handgun license issued by DPS
- United States military identification card containing the person's photograph
- United States citizenship certificate containing the person's photograph
- Passport

5	Agriculture; Tax exemptions	Property Tax Exemption on Retail Animal Feed Amendment	The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to exempt from ad valorem taxation tangible personal property consisting of animal feed held by the owner of the property for sale at retail.
